

Christina Demopoulos, DDS, MPH is the AAPHD National Immediate Past President, Professor, Biomedical Sciences-UNLV School of Dental Medicine. Dr. Demopoulos, DDS, MPH, is a faculty member at the UNLV School of Dental Medicine (SDM). She attended the University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV) for her undergraduate and her Master of Public Health (MPH) training. She received her dental degree from the University of Southern California (USC) and her dental public health training from the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio (UTHSCSA). She completed her Applied Behavior Analysis training and is eligible for the Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) exam. She is the current Faculty Advisor for the UNLV AAPHD Student Chapter and the Program Director for the UNLV School of Dental Medicine Advanced Dental Education Program in Dental Public Health. She is also the Immediate Past President for AAPHD and a Diplomate of the American Board of Dental Public Health (ABDPH). She serves on various local, state and national organizations.

Paula Ortega-Verdugo, DDS, MS, PhD is currently a fulltime (tenure-track) Assistant Professor at the University of California Los Angeles (UCLA) School of Dentistry, in the section of Public and Population Health. She obtained a Master of Science, a Certificate in Operative Dentistry, and a Ph.D. in Oral Sciences with emphasis in Dental Public Health. Earlier in her career, she worked in private and public health systems, in several primary care public health centers. Among her honors, she obtained the 2020 Keith E. Heller Dental Public Health Graduate Research Award for outstanding achievement among dental public health graduate students in The University of Iowa. In 2022, Dr. Ortega became a Diplomate of the American Board of Dental Public Health (ABDPH). Dr. Ortega-Verdugo specializes in key areas vital to advancing public oral health, including minimal intervention dentistry for managing dental caries, dentists' clinical decisionmaking, and Caries Management by Risk Assessment (CAMBRA). Her expertise further extends to understanding dental utilization among children, developing impactful oral health interventions, and promoting diversity within the dental workforce.



Jennifer Holtzman, DDS, MPH is the interim Executive Director of the Center for Oral Health. Dr. Holtzman formerly served as the Dental Officer at the Health Resources and Services Administration's (HRSA) Bureau of Health Workforce where she advised on workforce programs, led the postdoctoral and clinician educator oral health programs and served as Subject Matter Expert for the Advisory Committee on Training in Primary Care Medicine and Dentistry. Prior to joining HRSA, Dr Holtzman had careers in both private practice and academia. Dr Holtzman's academic career focused on public health dentistry establishing school-based/mobile oral health promotion disease prevention programs. academic research included investigating the association between oral health literacy and clinical outcomes, the use of non-invasive laser technology to detect caries, and the integration of oral health into primary care. She is a Diplomate of the American Board of Dental Public Health, serves as Secretary on the Board of the American Association for Public Health Dentistry, and is the incoming Chair of the American Dental Association's Council on Scientific Affairs.

A first-generation immigrant, Dr. Arratoonian enjoys mentoring future dental professionals and remains actively involved with her local health department, advocating for improved access to oral health in underserved communities. She also holds a Graduate Certificate in Community Oral Health from USC and a Master of Science in Health Systems from Cedars-Sinai, focusing on AI, digital health and health economics. A recipient of the Visionary Leader Award from the American Institute of Dental Public Health, she is passionate about advancing equity in oral health and inspiring the next generation of Dentists.

Abhi Thakkar, DDS, FICD, FACD, FPFA is a dedicated dentist driven by a deep-seated passion for helping others and a commitment to advancing oral health equity. After earning his Bachelor's in Dentistry in 2016, he pursued Advanced Training in Esthetics and Restorative Dentistry at the UCLA School of Dentistry in 2019, focusing on smile design, cosmetic dentistry, and minimally invasive techniques. As Dental Director at Camarena Health in Madera, California, he leads quality initiatives and community outreach while also serving as a Clinical Assistant Professor at Western University of Health Sciences. Dr. Thakkar is actively engaged in organized dentistry through the FMDS, ADA and CDA, where he participates in professional advocacy and lobbying efforts to advance oral health legislation. He also works with local health departments and serves on multiple advisory committees focused on education, quality improvement, and public health-bridging leadership, academia, and community service to elevate the collective impact of dentistry while shaping the next generation of dental professionals.

CUT IT OUT! ARE YOU KIDDING ME? GIVE ME THE F...

Caries management is not merely risk assessment, and certainly more than increased fluoride concentrations with greater application frequency. When the public is literally being led towards more tooth decay and away from timetested interventions, the oral healthcare infrastructure finds itself at a crossroads on a frontier. Can prevention be cost effective if it's not evidence based? Who are the oral health champions in dental settings?

In a world where preventionists are sidelined while the public hears nanohydroxyapatite cures tooth decay and fluoride will lower your IQ, will clinicians reach for an increasing volume of caries treatments with no peer reviewed research to back them up? The oral healthcare ecosystem is poised for some sort of revolution, but where are the weapons and what might they accomplish? Will you decide to offer patients cold surgical stainless steel and sunshine or sponges soaked in scaffolds and slippery silver particles applied with a paintbrush? What could go possibly go wrong?
